

An Intimate Partner Violence Intervention for New Mothers

Socially and economically disadvantaged first-time mothers are at risk for intimate partner violence. In a randomized trial with 492 participants, Jack and colleagues found that augmentation of a nurse home visitation program with a comprehensive intimate partner violence intervention, compared with the home visitation program alone, did not improve quality of life at 24 months after delivery.

Sedentary Behaviors in the US Population

Sedentary behaviors are associated with increased risks of obesity, cardiovascular disease, cancer, diabetes, and overall mortality. Yang and colleagues analyzed nationally representative surveys for 51896 participants in the United States and found that estimated total sitting time increased among adolescents and adults and computer use during leisure time increased among all age groups.

State Medicaid Expansion and Birth Outcome Disparities

Under the Affordable Care Act, states may expand Medicaid to adults with household incomes at or below 138% of the federal poverty level, which could improve access to health services and promote earlier use of prenatal care. Brown and colleagues compared outcomes for 15 631174 US births and found that disparities in birth outcomes for black infants compared with white infants declined among states that expanded Medicaid vs those that did not.
