Editorial

Oral glyburide is a less burdensome therapy for gestational diabetes than subcutaneous insulin, but glyburide may increase the risk of neonatal morbidity. Sénat and colleagues for the Groupe de Recherche en Obstétrique et Gynécologie randomized 914 patients with gestational diabetes and failed to show that glyburide is as safe as insulin. In an Editorial. Coustan and Barbour suggest that additional research on glyburide dosing is needed.

First-Line Treatments for Urinary Tract Infection

The emergence of antimicrobial resistance has led to the increased use of older antibiotics of uncertain efficacy. Huttner and colleagues randomized 513 women with symptoms of lower urinary tract infection and found that nitrofurantoin for 5 days, compared with singledose fosfomycin, was more likely to achieve a complete clinical response. In an Editorial, Datta and Juthani-Mehta suggest that nitrofurantoin may be the agent of choice for uncomplicated urinary tract infection, but new drugs for resistant uropathogens are needed.

CARING FOR THE CRITICALLY ILL PATIENT

Premedication for Intubation of Neonates

Pain control with sedation is recommended for neonates requiring endotracheal intubation, except in life-threatening situations. In a randomized clinical trial that enrolled 173 neonates requiring nonemergency intubation, Durrmeyer and colleagues for the PRET-TINEO Research Group found no difference in oxygen desaturation for atropine used with propofol vs atropine used with atracurium and sufentanil.


