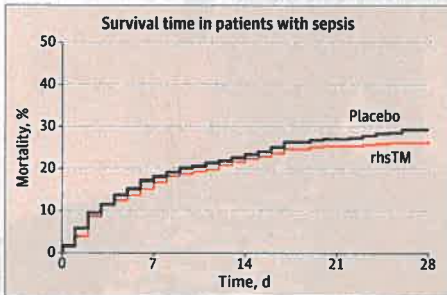
Laparoscopic Gastrectomy for Locally Advanced Gastric Cancer 1983

Laparoscopic distal gastrectomy is recommended for patients with early gastric cancer, but surgery for locally advanced gastric cancer is technically more challenging and its efficacy is uncertain. In a randomized trial of 1056 patients with locally advanced gastric cancer, Yu and colleagues for the Chinese Laparoscopic Gastrointestinal Surgery Study Group found that laparoscopic distal gastrectomy was noninferior to open distal gastrectomy for the outcome of 3-year disease-free survival.

A Novel Treatment for Sepsis-Associated Coagulopathy 1993



Coagulopathy is a risk factor for mortality in patients with sepsis. Vincent and colleagues for the SCARLET Trial Group randomized 816 patients with sepsis-associated coagulopathy and found that administration of a human recombinant thrombomodulin, compared with placebo, did not significantly reduce 28-day all-cause mortality. In an Editorial, van der Poll suggests that

the potential benefit of soluble human recombinant thrombomodulin (rhsTM) may depend on the timing of administration and the use of heparin as concurrent therapy.

Novel Clinical Phenotypes for Sepsis 2003

The effectiveness of treatment for sepsis may vary by the clinical and biological features of the disease. Seymour and colleagues analyzed data for 20189 patients with sepsis and identified 4 clinical phenotypes that correlated with host response patterns and clinical outcomes. In an Editorial, Knaus and Marks suggest that these phenotypes may just reflect variations in organ system failure or severity of illness, but it is possible they could be supplemented with other information to identify subsets of patients requiring specific immunotherapeutic approaches.

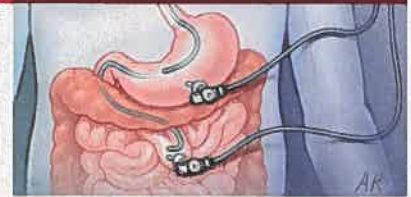

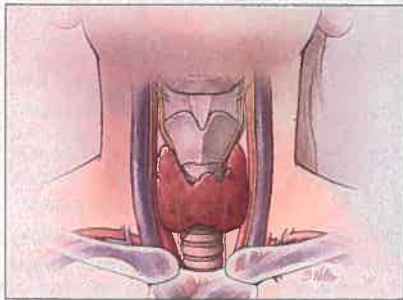
