Acute coronary syndromes

MINOCA

Clinical assessment and differential diagnosis

Exclude other causes of MINOCA
 (e.g. Takotsubo, myocardiitis, coronary embolism, periprosthetic ETV, etc.)

CCB dose reduction or discontinuation at follow-up

Suspected coronary vasomotion alterations

Positive

Provocative test
 Asymptomatic or Symptomatic

Negative

Patients with acute myocardial infarction and non-obstructive coronary arteries: safety and prognostic relevance of invasive coronary provocative tests


