

A prospective study at a single endoscopy unit found that the estimated carbon footprint for every 100 gastrointestinal procedures was high, at 1501 kg carbon dioxide equivalents, which equates to 1680 pounds of coal burned, and that up to 20% of this could be reduced if appropriate waste segregation were performed.
