After treatment for Barrett's neoplasia, the risk of dying from other causes than esophageal cancer is 40 times higher and predictable. This risk should therefore be considered in guidelines on follow-up after treatment.

This study sheds light on the cross talk between B cells and CXCL13<sup>+</sup>CD103<sup>+</sup>CD8<sup>+</sup> tissue-resident memory T cells in promoting cancer immunotherapy by revealing a specific cellular communication through the lymphotoxin- $\alpha$ /tumor necrosis factor receptor type 2 axis within the tertiary lymphoid structures.

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The enteric nervous system, the gut's "brain," originates from a single source of progenitor cells instead of 2, as previously believed, which greatly simplifies understanding developmental enteric nervous system disorders.
