
Atorvastatin Prior to Percutaneous Coronary Intervention

Statin drugs may help to stabilize coronary lesions. Berwanger and colleagues for the SECURE-PCI Investigators randomized 4191 patients with acute coronary syndrome and found that loading doses of atorvastatin before and after percutaneous coronary intervention did not reduce the rate of major adverse cardiovascular events. Negative Wealth Shock and All-Cause Mortality

The association of lower socioeconomic status and adverse health outcomes may be exacerbated by the stress of a sudden loss of wealth. In a nationally representative prospective cohort study of US adults aged 51 to 61 years, Pool and colleagues found that loss of wealth over 2 years was associated with an increased risk for all-cause mortality. In an Editorial, Garber suggests that wealth shock

has implications for health behaviors and patient well-being, irrespective of whether it is a direct cause of mortality or a marker of underlying health risks.

Solid Fuel Use and Mortality in Rural China

When combusted, solid fuels such as wood and charcoal emit airborne particulate matter. In a prospective cohort study of 271 217 adults from rural China, Yu and colleagues found that associations of solid fuel use with cardiovascular and all-cause mortality were lower for those who had previously switched to clean fuels or used cookstoves with ventilation.
