
Worldwide, the prevalence of diabetes in Hispanic and Asian populations is higher than in populations of European or African origin. Cheng and colleagues analyzed data from nationally representative cross-sectional surveys of 7575 US adults and found that the prevalence of diabetes and undiagnosed diabetes varied by race and ethnicity and among Hispanic and non-Hispanic Asian subpopulations. In an Editorial, Matsushita and colleagues suggest that future studies should rely on definitions for diabetes and prediabetes that more closely reflect clinical practice.

Invasive Haemophilus influenzae Infection

2399



Risk factors for invasive nontypeable Haemophilus influenzae infection include chronic lung disease, malignancy, pregnancy, and HIV infection. Collins and colleagues analyzed data for 553 adults and found that 2 genetically related clonal strains were associated with septic arthritis among black men who have sex with men and were living in geographic proximity.

Premature Menopause and Cardiovascular Disease

Premature menopause has been reported to be associated with an increased risk of coronary artery disease and stroke. Honigberg and colleagues conducted a cohort study of 144 260 postmenopausal women and found that menopause before the age of 40 years was associated with an increased risk of cardiovascular disease.
