

Vitamin D increases the synthesis of the antimicrobial peptide cathelicidin in respiratory epithelium and inhibits replication of influenza virus. A randomized clinical trial by Aglipay and colleagues of 703 children aged 1 to 5 years found that high-dose vs standard-dose vitamin D supplementation did not reduce the rate of upper respiratory tract infections.

Adult Weight Gain and Health Outcomes in Later Life

Most excess weight is gained during the transition from early to middle adulthood. In an observational study of 118140 US men and women, Zheng and colleagues found that weight gain in young adulthood was associated with increased risks of major chronic diseases and mortality and decreased odds of healthy aging. An Editorial by Dietz suggests that the development of overweight and obesity may be related to life course transitions such as leav-

Hospital Readmission Penalties and Mortality

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services reduces payments to hospitals with higherthan-expected readmission rates. Dharmarajan and colleagues conducted a retrospective study of Medicare fee-for-service beneficiaries with 2962554 hospitalizations for heart failure, 1229 939 hospitalizations for acute myocardial infarction, and 2544530 hospitalizations for pneumonia; the investigators found that reductions in hospital 30-day readmission rates were associated with lower mortality rates after hospital discharge. In an Editorial, Joynt Maddox finds it reassuring that readmission penalties do not appear to have increased mortality but cautions that financial incentives to reduce readmissions may inadvertently harm patients in other ways.
